#### **Father Cosmas' Reflection**

#### Using my gifts to serve God

The parable of the talents as narrated in today's Gospel (Matthew 25:14-30) is a thought-provoking lesson on stewardship, responsibility, and the utilization of God-given gifts. It narrates the story of a master who entrusts varying amounts of talents (a form of currency) to three of his servants before embarking on a journey. Two of the servants invest and multiply their talents, while the third buries his out of fear. Upon the master's return, he commends the first two servants for their faithfulness and wise use of the talents, while the third servant's fear-driven inaction results in rebuke and loss.

At its core, this parable speaks to the nature of stewardship—how we manage and employ the resources, abilities, and opportunities bestowed upon us by God. The talents represent more than just monetary value; they symbolize the diverse gifts, skills, and potentials uniquely given to each individual.

The master's allocation of talents reflects God's generous distribution of blessings in our lives. He doesn't expect uniformity in the talents bestowed; rather, He desires that we utilize and multiply these gifts according to our abilities. The first two servants exhibit initiative, diligence, and risk-taking—qualities we're encouraged to emulate. They understand the responsibility entrusted to them and diligently work to grow what they've been

Conversely, the third servant's fear and complacency lead to his downfall. He views his talent through a lens of fear, choosing to bury it rather than risk losing it. His inaction signifies a lack of trust in the master and a failure to recognize the potential for growth and development.

This parable challenges us to examine our attitudes toward the gifts and opportunities we've received. It prompts reflection on how we invest our time, talents, and resources in service to God and others. It's a reminder that God doesn't expect us to possess equal talents or opportunities but desires faithful stewardship of what we've been given.
