Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am writing to share with you an update on the 2026 Lenten Collection. To date, we have received a total of \$93,326.11 from our parishes to be allocated to agencies serving our communities' vulnerable populations. Your tremendous charity is not only a blessing to those who will receive assistance from the agencies funded, but also to yourselves, as you participate in the building of the Kingdom of God. Truly I can say along with St. Paul that "You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity" (2 Cor 9:11). Please be assured of my gratitude for your charity. Our finance department has rounded the total to \$93,300.00 to make distribution easier. The remaining funds and any additional donations received in 2026 will be rolled over to the 2027 collection.

I would also like to extend by warm thanks to the Lenten Collection Committee, comprised of young parishioners from across the Archdiocese. With the cost of living continuing to rise, committee members prioritized agencies addressing food insecurity, especially rural food banks. Remaining funds were allocated to local agencies providing relief for those in material and spiritual poverty and international relief efforts addressing crisis situations.

There is a hazard to become overwhelmed when confronted by the needs of our brothers and sisters that seem to grow in magnitude and complexity year after year. And yet the Christian confronts these challenges with a great hope that Christ has conquered the world (John 16:33). Indeed, to live "in the power of his Resurrection" (Philippians 3:10) is to live with the bold faith that "the kingdom of God is among you" (Luke 17:21). Through the Paschal Mystery we have become active co-builders of our Lord's community of love and mercy, here and now. My prayer is that the Archdiocesan Lenten Collection continues to be evidence of how small acts of love contribute to a wider community of love for all.
